Captain Theodore (Ted) Hack, USN (Retired)

From 1997 until his retirement in 2016, Captain Hack was General Dynamics' primary Government Relations liaison with Congress and the Navy on submarine and submarine-related

programs. He was directly responsible for liaison with the US Congress on several very successful programs, such as Subsurface guided nuclear (SSGN, Seawolf Class, Virginia Class, Virginia Payload Module (VPM), and Ohio Class Replacement (Columbia Class) programs. Importantly, he successfully coordinated Congressional and Industry efforts to increase Virginia Class submarine production rates to its current two submarines per year.

During a distinguished 30-year Naval career, served as Assistant Chief of Staff for Warfare Requirements, Planning and Assessments (N8) for the U.S. Atlantic Submarine Force. Commanded the USS ORION (AS 18), homeported in La Maddalena, Italy. Prior to the ORION, was Director of Navy Programs and Congressional Liaison Officer for Submarine Programs in the Office of Legislative Affairs in the Pentagon. Before his Pentagon tour, Captain Hack commanded the USS GUARDFISH (SSN 612) where he was awarded the Navy Distinguished Service Medal for conducting an operation of significant importance to national security, and GUARDFISH earned a Navy Unit Commendation.

Graduated from Villanova University in 1967 with a Bachelor of Engineering in Electrical Engineering. He is also a graduate of Naval Nuclear Power Training and Naval Submarine School. He is and has been involved with committees of the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA), the Navy League, the Naval Submarine League, and is on the Board of the American Shipbuilding Suppliers Association (ASSA). Currently a consultant for commercial industry efforts to provide material support to submarine programs.

Captain Hack resides in Lewes Delaware with his wife Patty.

Mr. Frank Manning

Frank E. Manning Jr. was born and raised in the Lincoln Park area of Chicago, Illinois. He enlisted in the United States Coast Guard on July 1, 1964. His first duty station after Boot Camp was the Delaware Lightship, WLV-529/LV-107. He served aboard this vessel for one year. He is a member of the Overfalls Foundation and a tour guide for the Overfalls Lightship. He very much enjoys sharing with our visitors the history of this unique vessel.

Brian North has a long-standing interest in nautical matters and wants to give back to the Lewes community. He would like to contribute to the continued development of the role the Foundation and the Overfalls play in our community. His interest in being on and near the water began while growing up on the North Shore of Long Island, where he spent time boating with friends and family. His grandfather had a shipyard and a marina, where he worked during the summers.

Brian's family has lived in Lewes since 1988, when they built their house near the beach. They were part-time residents until 2021, when he and his wife Pam moved from the Philadelphia

Brian is a corporate attorney with a national law firm, based in its Philadelphia office. He has been with the firm for over 26 years and has been a practicing lawyer in Pennsylvania for over 47 years.
